

## ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENTS

Electronic waste, or e-waste, includes items like old computers, televisions, electrical cords, game consoles, and more. It is illegal in New York State to put these items into the garbage because special care is required to recycle them.

The City offers an electronics recycling program once per year, typically in the Fall. Registration is required and is available at:

### Eligible items/services:

- Electronics
- Appliances
- Paper shredding
- Rechargeable batteries
- Tire disposal (fees associated with this item)

## ELECTRONICS

### Electronics examples:

- TVs
- Computers
- Gaming consoles
- Cellphones
- Servers
- Electrical cords and cables



### Appliances examples:

- Refrigerators
- Air conditioners
- Dehumidifiers
- Washers/dryers



### Tire disposal has associated fees:

- Bicycle: \$1/tire
- Passenger vehicle: \$5/tire
- All other tires (size dependent): \$10 – \$100/tire

### Additionally, there are other ways to recycle electronic waste, including:

- Recycling/trade-in programs at local electronics retailers
- Drop offs at secondhand stores
- Call the Department of Public Works Dispatcher at (518) 270-4579 to schedule a bulk pick-up. Moderate fees apply

## BATTERIES

Batteries are split into two categories: rechargeable and single-use.

**Rechargeable batteries must always be brought to a special collection event** - if thrown out or put into your recycling bin, they can cause fires putting our Sanitation Team at risk.

### Examples of Single-Use Batteries:

- Alkaline
- Button-cell/coin
- Zinc-Carbon



To safely dispose of your single-use batteries, reach out to your local STAPLES store about their battery take-back program.

### Examples of Rechargeable Batteries:

- Li-ion
- Ni-Cad
- Ni-MH



Rechargeable batteries are also eligible for our electronics events.
