Troy Officials Issue Traffic Advisories, Parking Restriction Reminders

TROY, NY – With the start of Troy’s summer entertainment schedule and ongoing scheduled road paving operations, major infrastructure projects, and transportation network improvements Mayor Patrick Madden today is asking for resident’s cooperation to assist local crews conducting annual maintenance work in neighborhoods across Troy to ensure a smooth transition into the summer season.

Mayor Patrick Madden said, “The arrival of summer signals a new wave of activity across the Collar City, from our exciting summer events to important roadway maintenance and repair operations. Cooperation from the public will allow our crews to conduct this year’s important municipal improvement projects without interruption and ensure residents and visitors from across Troy and the Capital Region can continue to explore our community and enjoy our diverse mix of restaurants, shops and signature entertainment options all season long.”

Street Paving

The City’s Bureau of Streets has started 2018 street paving operations. The following streets are scheduled for resurfacing and paving on Friday, May 8.

- Munro Court

Motorists are asked to reduce speeds, use caution and watch for flaggers while traveling through work zones to ensure the safety of workers. Temporary lane closures and parking restrictions are possible. The public should observe all posted parking restrictions in and around work areas. Local emergency services will be notified of traffic restrictions and lane closures as necessary. Paving work will be dependent on weather conditions. The City of Troy thanks everyone for their patience at this time while crews conduct paving operations throughout the summer months.

Parking Restrictions

City officials have issued various traffic advisories and parking restrictions associated with special events scheduled throughout the 2018 summer season.

Rockin' on the River

Parking will be prohibited in the Front Street lot from 12:00 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 6 for the annual Rockin' on the River concert series, the free, 9-week outdoor summer music series held on Wednesday nights between June and August in Riverfront Park. Parking restrictions will occur every Wednesday through Thursday, August 8 (excluding Wednesday, July 4). Troy Waterfront Farmers Market

City officials have issued a traffic advisory for River Street, Broadway, and State Street in the City of Troy, New York for the weekly Troy Waterfront Farmers Market. The following streets will be closed between 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Saturday, May 9:

- River Street, between 3rd Street and State Street
- 2nd Street between Broadway and State Street
- Broadway between 3rd Street and River Street

Little Italy Stickball Tournament

City officials have issued a traffic advisory for Hill Street for the 10th annual "Stick it to Homelessness" Stickball Tournament. Beginning 11:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., Sunday, May 10, Hill Street will be closed to regular vehicle traffic between Washington and Liberty Streets. Drivers should observe all posted parking restrictions. Illegally parked vehicles will be ticketed and towed, both at the owner's expense.

Uncle Sam Bike Trail

Work associated with the Uncle Sam Trail extension project is nearing completion. Residents and motorists are reminded to watch for updated signage indicating permanent changes to on-

street parking on Burden Avenue, 1st Street between Adams and Madison Streets, and River Street between Division and Adams Streets. Removable bollards will also be installed to delineate traffic lanes and ensure the safety of riders using the trail.

One Monument Square

City officials have also announced parking restrictions at the former City Hall site located at One Monument Square due to work associated with the seawall stabilization project on Troy's waterfront. Beginning 9:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 6, parking will be prohibited at the former City Hall site. Parking restrictions will remain in place until further notice. Illegally parked vehicles will be ticketed and towed, both at the owner's expense.

Street parking in the Central Business District is limited to two (2) hours, from 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., and four (4) hours in designated areas with metered pay stations. There is a variety of parking garages and surface lots available for public parking in historic downtown Troy. The city offers a monthly permit rate for all lots and garages, and a daily rate for non-permitted vehicles. To purchase a monthly or daily parking permit please contact the City Treasurer's Office at (518) 279-7310. All city-operated parking lots and garages are available for free parking during nights and weekends.
